## Why the Barclay's Premier League is the Best

Secondly, the physical style and pace that soccer is played within the Premier League is incredible. table that will land in contending spots. This 2015 season is a perfect example of such: last year's title winners and large power house in the English Premier League (Chelsea) is sitting in the 16th spot of the league. Conversely, you have two other teams that are generally never seen in the top 5 spots that are sitting currently in the 4th and 5th place spot, those teams being Crystal Palace and Leicester City. In his article, Taherzadeh makes a great point when comparing other leagues, such as La Liga, to the Premier League's competition: "La Liga might have the two most star-studded teams on the planet in Barcelona and Real Madrid, but it's essentially a twohorse race with occasional cameos from the likes of Atletico Madrid. The Premier League, like all major European leagues, is dominated by its wealthiest clubs, but it is a far less predictable competition." The key word about his statement is predictability. It can be quite challenging to select who will win the title in the Premier League each and every season, this simply demonstrates the competition level the league has.

Premier League is tremendous through their devotion, love, and passion for not only their teams, but for the game of soccer. In regards to the Premier League fans, Taherzadeh states, "There are people who are virtually married to the teams they support, and there are so many rousing songs that ring out around the grounds and create a dramatic, and sometimes even moving, atmosphere at Premier League games each week, that it's hard to deny the impact of the matchgoing public." Fans for any sport always have a grea impact and make the sports they cheer for that much better with the enthusiasm that they bring. Fans of the Premier League are on a whole different level as Taherzadeh mentioned previously.
