Secondly, Davis made : large jump from

his 2013-14 season to his 2014-15 season in field goal percentage and his mid range capability. In 2013-14 he sat at a .519 field

goal percentage and last year finished with a .535 percentage. With his quick ability to blow by defenders, it is hard to read

will truly help him perfect his talent and without a doubt, could land him in a high contention spot for the MVP Award this season.



Take James Harden, for example; his offensive skill is insane, and he is hands down one the toughest guys to guard in the NBA. Because he is very talented offensively, analysts will tend to push aside his lack of good defensive play when putting him amongst one of their top contenders for the MVP award. But with Anthony Davis, he possesses not only a great offensive game but a great defensive one as well. Anthony Davis has really made a statement last year on both ends with his tremendous improvement. Just imagine what he will do this year.
